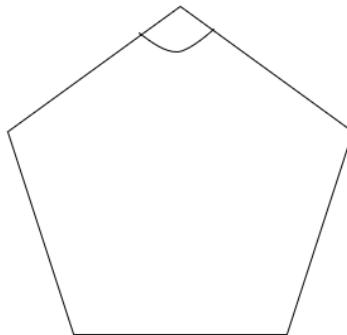

Two Volcanoes

1. Leah thought there was a good chance that her volcano project would win first place at the
2. Science fair. She had covered a glass tube with a cone-shaped wire frame and plaster. Then
3. she had painted it brown, so the cone looked like an authentic mountain. When it was her turn
4. to present her project, she would put baking soda into the glass tube and add vinegar to it. The
5. vinegar and acid would cause a chemical reaction, and the mixture would bubble up out of the
6. top. She even added red food colouring to the vinegar to make the mixture look like hot lava.
7. The handwritten notecards next to the model on the display explained how a volcano erupts.

8. Rachel thought it was very likely that her volcano would win first place at the science fair. She
9. had sculpted a mountain from brown clay and had shaped pieces of red, orange, and black
10. clay to represent lava flowing down the sides. She had even formed small rocks and trees out
11. of clay and used toothpicks to stick them to the mountain slopes. The detailed display featured
12. several notecards with neatly hand-lettered titles and interesting facts about volcanoes.
