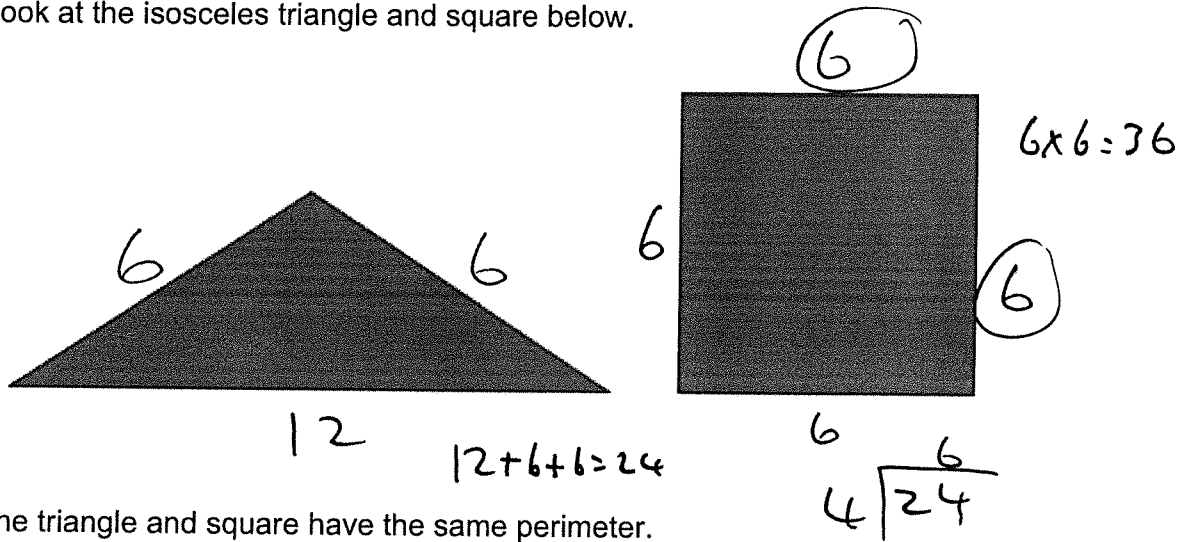

Look at the isosceles triangle and square below.



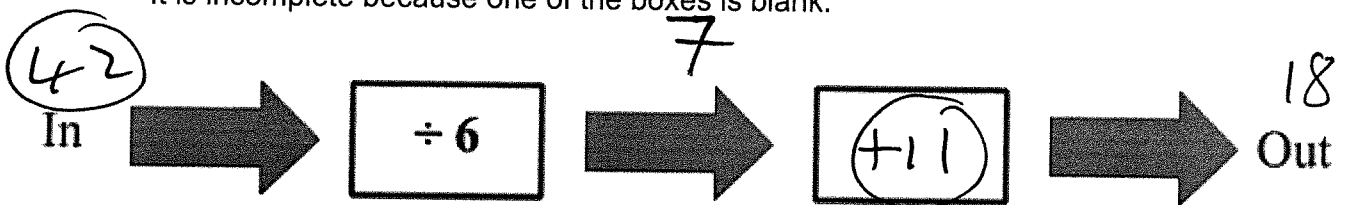
If the sides of the triangle are 12 cm and 6 cm, what is the area of the square?

Choose the function from the answers below that make the statement true.

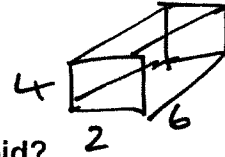
