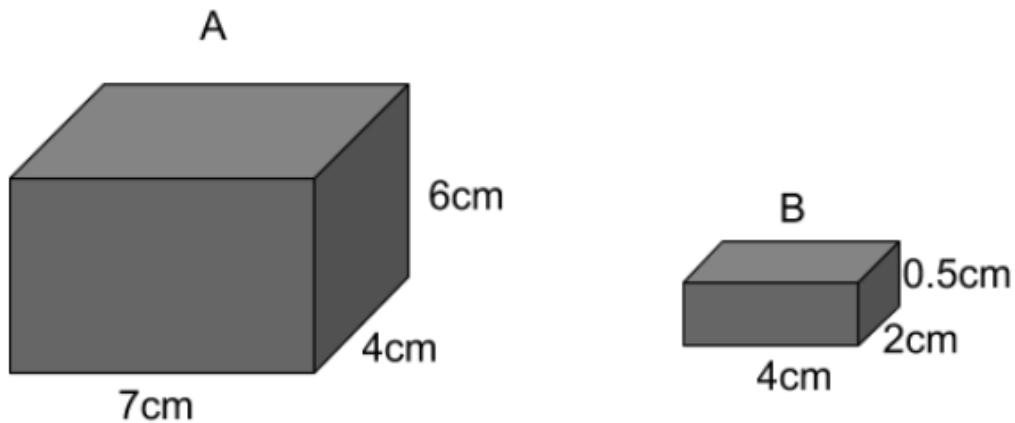

Look at the two cuboids below.



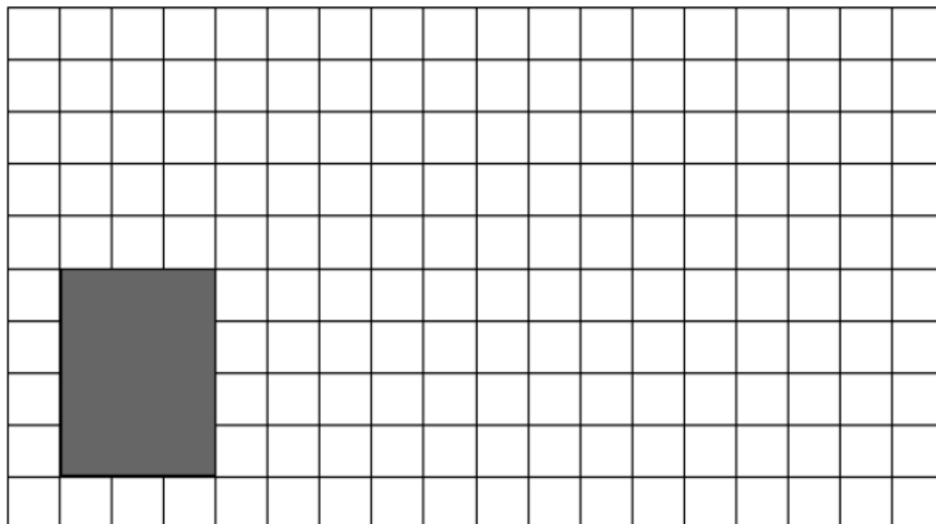

Song 2: 4 minutes 37 seconds

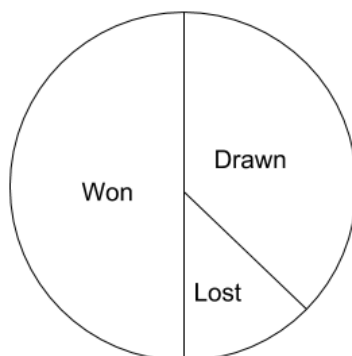
Song 3: 5 minutes 17 seconds

What is the total length of time the three songs play while Liam is running?

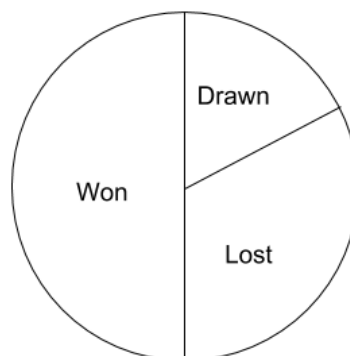
